The Public Defender Service can provide the following assistance:

Advocacy Team:

- CAN accept instructions from the Court for the Appointment of an Advocate under the provisions of section 38 of the Youth Justice and Criminal Evidence Act 1999 where the Defendant/Appellant is Prohibited by Law or by Order of the Court from Cross-Examining Particular Witnesses in Person under Sections 34, 35 & 36 of the Act.
- 2. **CAN** accept instructions from the Court for the Appointment of an Advocate under Section 4A of the Criminal Procedure (Insanity) Act 1964 (Archbold 2024 4-233) on a finding of fact jury trial, to represent the defendant who is under a disability.
- 3. **CAN** accept instructions and represent any defendant who is eligible for legal aid or has the benefit of a Representation Order. In particular, we can represent defendants where an existing representation order is transferred to the PDS by the Court. However, it must be borne in mind that a defendant must agree to the PDS representing them.
- 4. **CAN** accept instructions from any firm of solicitors to act for a defendant on a privately paying basis.
- 5. **CANNOT** accept instructions from any defendant directly. Defendants must first agree that the PDS can represent them and then instruct a firm of solicitors.

Solicitors Team:

- CAN accept instructions and represent any defendant who is eligible for legal aid or has the benefit of a Representation Order
- 2. **CAN** assist Courts by taking over cases where the Court deems it necessary for another legal team be instructed, where the Representation Order can be transferred.
