1	The Head of Healthcare and the manager of the integrated mental health team should ensure that prisoners with mental health issues have appropriate reviews and care plans which are recorded and implemented.	Accepted	Patients referred to the Mental Health team will be added to the team case load and those identified with mental health needs will undergo a full assessment, and have a mental health care plan created in line with national clinical guidelines. The care plan will be recorded on the required database and updated as necessary following any subsequent appointments. Any changes or issues highlighted with regard to care plans will be discussed in the Mental Health disciplinary meetings	Head of Healthcare PPG	Completed
2	The Head of Healthcare should ensure that the prisoner's history and risk factors for suicide and self-harm are taken into account medication in possession risk assessments.	Accepted	In possession medication risk assessments are completed during a prisoner's reception process and is routinely updated on a yearly basis. The risk assessment is comprehensive and in depth and will advise on the level of medication possession from supervised to 7 days in possession, and 14 days in	Head of Healthcare PPG	Completed

			possession. If it is suspected a prisoner is at risk of self-harm, suicide ideation or has any mental health concerns the risk assessment will be redone and the appropriate action taken. However, if the clinician has any concerns about the level of risk identified on the template the risk assessment is adjusted appropriately.		
3	The Governor should ensure that staff are aware of the signs of rigor mortis, and fully understand the circumstances in which they should not start, or continue, resuscitation, in line with Resuscitation Council Guidelines.	Accepted	Guidance to all staff regarding when it is appropriate to start, or not start, resuscitation has been reissued.
