1	The Governor of HMP Risley should ensure that staff are aware of their responsibilities in operating the Tackling Anti-Social Behaviour and Incentives and Earned Privileges strategies in relation to illicit drug use and that measures taken are proportionate to the individual prisoner.	Accepted	In October 2018 a new national model for managing all types of violence and anti-social behaviour, CSIP (Care Support Intervention Plan) was introduced, replacing the Tackling Anti-Social Behaviour strategy. For each CSIP progressed there is a bespoke intervention plan for each prisoner which is used to engage, work with, support and enable individuals to progress in a positive way. Guidance has been published and issued to all staff via global email detailing CSIP, how it works and when it should be used, to ensure that it is applied appropriately. This information will be made available on each wing and work area, as well as on the computer shared drive. A notice to staff will also be issued to remind staff that they must consider what other measures are in place when applying the IEP scheme in relation to illicit drug use, to ensure that actions taken are proportionate. 2	The Governor of HMP Risley should ensure that staff always make a referral to drug treatment services when a prisoner is found to be under the influence of PS.	Accepted	<p>A global email will be sent out to all staff in January 2019 reminding them of the need to report all incidents of PS use, how to refer to CGL and that a referral must always be made to CGL when a prisoner has been found under the influence. CGL are also now able to access the Orderly Officers log each day so that they can check any reported incidents of PS use.</p> <p>A monthly safer custody briefing sheet has also been introduced and is issued to each residential unit and partner agency, delivering information about various safer custody issues. The briefing sheet will also be used to provide regular reminders to staff of their responsibilities when a prisoner is found to be under the influence of PS.</p> <p>The Head of Safer Custody is currently exploring the introduction of a trial where CGL staff will be invited to attend adjudications for prisoners found under the influence to enable them to support the prisoner.</p>	<p>Head of Reducing Reoffending January 2019</p> <p>Head of Safer Custody March 2019</p>
