1	The Head of Healthcare at HMP Exeter should ensure that prisoners who are assessed as being at risk of opioid overdose are provided with naloxone training at the earliest opportunity and given a naloxone kit when they leave prison.	Accepted	<p>Since Mr Ghanem's death the Healthcare team have scrutinised their processes (January 2022) and now look to review any opiate use and offer Naloxone to all opiate users (current or past).</p> <p>All opiate clients are trained in the use of Naloxone, and this done throughout release planning sessions and sometime earlier.</p> <p>We encourage all clients being released to take a Naloxone kit; the discharge coordinator role also promotes the kits as well as the departure lounge therefore there are three opportunities for prisoners to be issued with the kits.</p>	Head of Healthcare	Complete
