1	The Head of Healthcare and the Substance Misuse Lead should ensure that there is a system in place to provide follow up appointments to those undertaking an opiate detoxification programme and includes a failsafe to ensure staff are alerted to those who have not been reviewed at the end of the programme.	Accepted	When patients have completed an Opiate Detoxification Programme they will be reviewed after seven days of completion by the substance misuse team. The patient will be added to ledger and will also be referred to CGL for ongoing psychosocial support. The Operational Policy for Substance Misuse reflects the above recommendation. 2	The Governor and Head of Healthcare should identify the best way to share intelligence and manage risk around alcohol misuse in those with substance misuse problems.	Accepted	The National Drug Strategy Framework has recently been updated and therefore the prison will be updating the local Drug Strategy in line with this. The new strategy will include collaborative actions and work between the prison, Healthcare and the Substance Misuse provider. Prisoners identified to be under-the-influence are identified in each morning meeting. 		Misuse service to share intelligence around those suspected or detected to be under-the-influence. The reports from Security and Healthcare are compared to ensure a consistency of identification and reporting, and those who are identified to need additional support are referred to the Safety Intervention Meeting (SIM) to be considered for CSIP support, or other support as required. Healthcare are in attendance at this weekly meeting. There is also a monthly Drug Strategy meeting to discuss trends of those found under-the-influence and finds of illicit drugs and alcohol. To manage the risk around alcohol misuse in patients with substance misuse problems an assessment will be completed by a registered nurse regarding the patients fermenting liquid consumption. Fermenting liquid presents the following risks including intoxication, poisoning, and/or or withdrawal. A registered nurse will conduct an immediate assessment using the ABCDE approach (Airway, Breathing, Circulation, Disability, Exposure) to identify and address life-threatening conditions. Record vital signs (BP, respiratory rate, SPO2, heart rate, temperature). • Obtain a history of the patients fermenting liquid consumption (amount, time of ingestion). • Enquire about symptoms such as:	Oxleas NHS Foundation Trust	February 2025

			• Drowsiness or confusion • Nausea and vomiting • Abdominal Pain • Dizziness or headaches • Slurred speech or loss of coordination • Changes in behaviour such as aggression Implement a management plan: • Activate Code Blue for severe symptoms like unresponsiveness or seizures. • Provide supportive care for mild-to-moderate intoxication (hydration, oxygen therapy). • Monitor neurological status using the AVPU (Alert, Verbal, Pain, Unresponsive) scale. Monitoring and Observations: • Monitor using National Early Warning Score (NEWS2) • Record vital signs every at least 30 minutes for 2 hours, reducing frequency if stable. Patients will be reviewed referred to CGL to additional support.
