2	<p>The Director and Head of Healthcare at Parc should liaise with the Medical Director for G4S and arrange an urgent meeting with the Chief Executive of Abertawe Bro Morgannwg University Health Board to ensure that full service provision for patients with suspected dementia is made within 3 months of this report, and that in the interim patients requiring access are not refused care.</p>	Accepted	<p>The Medical Director along with key stakeholders will arrange a meeting with the Chief Executive of the Local Health Board to discuss future access to secondary specialist care providers for men at Parc.</p> <p>The existing process for applying for access entails men suspected of having dementia being referred to Secondary care by the GP.
