Accepted	A notice to staff will be distributed which will highlight the required duties in relation to ACCT management procedures, for example completing quality assurance checks in line with national policy. Senior managers will provide a comprehensive overview of findings to the case manager and any recurrent issues will be discussed on an individual basis. Any additional upskilling required will be delivered to staff by the safer custody custodial manager.	Head of Safer Custody, HMPPS	March 2025
2	The Prison Group Director for West Midlands should outline in the action plan the steps she has taken to satisfy herself that effective action is being taken to improve ACCT quality assurance at Stoke Heath.	Accepted	The Prison Group Director (PGD) for the West Midlands has tasked the Group Safety Lead and Deputies to regularly review and monitor the effectiveness of the local ACCT quality assurance processes. Where good practice is identified this is shared and where learning is required this is actioned immediately. Accepted	<p>Violence reduction staff and representatives will investigate all reported incidents of bullying and intimidation. All alleged perpetrators from these incidents will be considered and, where appropriate, will be referred for Challenge, Support and Intervention Plan (CSIP). Additionally, any evidence collated will be utilised to challenge alleged perpetrators via the adjudication process. Identified victims of bullying are supported by the violence reduction and residential unit staff, and they will also be considered for support via the CSIP process. Peer support is also available and will be promoted on all wings.
