A capillary test will be performed when a sensor is not available. In the event that a diabetic patient declines a blood glucose test, staff must record this information clearly in the prisoner's medical record. Airedale NHS Trust who are responsible for providing diabetic services via telemedicine, have commenced a diabetic case review for complex patients and clinicians. They will continue to monitor the use of glucose tablets and ensure a diabetic and dietetic review is completed, if necessary. All complex patients will be referred to this pathway to ensure there is robust care planning and management in place. All prisoners at HMP The Verne will have a in possession risk assessment in place which will be reviewed annually or in the event of an incident, including when ACCT's are opened.
