Accepted	There is now a long-term conditions pathway from reception into the LTC service. 2 Senior nurses have been employed to manage long term conditions on site in Jan 2023 as this was previous overseen by an agency nurse 2 days per week. This means at HMP Northumberland there is now a 5-day clinical service to manage LTCs. In July 2023, a clinical lead has been employed to clinically lead the long-term conditions service and complex cases. Thay have responsibility for auditing referral times, pathways and clinically supervising the senior nurses. 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individualised patient focused and based upon best practice in line with NICE guidance. The quality of their care plans and clinical interactions are audited by the clinical lead to ensure quality.
All patients are recalled on a minimum of an annual recall for follow up and monitoring of their chronic condition.
There is now a substantive GP on site 5 days for medical oversight of patients with chronic conditions.
There is a business case in place for a further full time senior nurse to supplement the LTC service.
