1	The Head of Healthcare should ensure that all clinical staff are fully conversant with the contents of the emergency resuscitation bag and arrange an onsite reflective training session by an advanced resuscitation practitioner.	Accepted	<p>All of those who are expected to carry out the role of First Responder (Hotel 1) have had Immediate Life Support Training and are made familiar with the contents of the emergency bags. Daily checks are carried out and logged for the 2 emergency bags and these checks are also carried out after the security tag is breached; noting what was used and replaced.</p> <p>Once a week; the ledger instructs the nurse on duty at the weekend to do a full inspection of the emergency bag. This involves checking the expiry dates and contents against a checklist. ILS training is refreshed every year and this is monitored by the Head of Healthcare</p>	Head of Healthcare, Practice Plus Group	Completed

2	The Head of Healthcare should ensure that the process of random checks on prisoners that have medication in possession, by monitoring the collection process and cross checking with any hospital discharge letters, is included within the audit schedule.	Accepted	The Regional Pharmacy team have developed a Local Operating Procedure (ratified in October 24), which includes protocols for following up on those who haven't ordered monthly prescriptions. A percentage of those on IP medications are audited and subject to compliance checks and this is managed on a ledger.	Head of Healthcare, Practice Plus Group	Completed
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
