1	The Head of Healthcare should review how the GP service manages abnormal blood markers in the context of unintentional weight loss.	Accepted	At the Doctors Meeting on 18/03/26 there will be a facilitated discussion in relation to: Policies regarding abnormal blood markers and unexplained weight loss that are primarily focused on the early detection of underlying diseases, particularly cancer, malabsorption, or chronic inflammation. NICE (National Institute for Health and Care Excellence) guidelines (NG12) dictate that unexplained weight loss, especially when combined with abnormal blood markers (such as raised inflammatory markers or anaemia), warrants urgent investigation. At the next Doctors Meeting (18/03/26) there will be a discussion in relation to ensuring baseline weights recorded on SystmOne are reviewed when abnormal blood results are reviewed on SystmOne. 2	The Head of Healthcare should establish a formal dietetic referral pathway for any prisoner experiencing unintentional weight loss.	Accepted	There is an established referral pathway with Swansea University Health Board. A meeting was held on 11/03/2026 between the healthcare Lead and Dietetic service Lead to review the pathway It was agreed that staff would be reminded of the requirements of the pathway.
