Accepted	All staff at HMP Forest Bank involved in the reception process who deal with newly arrived prisoners have been reminded of the need to ensure that when a prisoner's known risk factors are highlighted they are considered and documented within the necessary records. The record must explain whether ACCT monitoring has been considered, and if the decision is to not open an ACCT the reasons why must be detailed in light of the known risks factors. To ensure staff understand the resuscitation guidance, safer custody staff will attend briefings where they will check for any knowledge gaps.
