



Staff survey methodology

A survey of staff is carried out at the start of every scrutiny visit, the results of which contribute to the evidence base for the visit.

HMI Prisons researchers developed an online questionnaire consisting of structured questions exploring how the COVID-19 crisis has affected staff, and their views on how it has affected prisoners. There are also two open questions which allow staff to describe any learning from the COVID-19 crisis, and tell inspectors anything else they think is important. These comments are not published or shared with the establishment.

Distribution

HMI Prisons researchers provide a link to the survey embedded in a covering email. The covering email explains the purpose of the survey, that participation is voluntary and gives assurances about confidentiality and anonymity, enabling staff to give their informed consent to participate. This email is sent to the establishment with a request that it is forwarded to all staff working at the establishment; an HMI Prisons researcher is copied into this email to provide assurance.

Survey response

The survey was sent to 400 email addresses at HMYOI Wetherby and Keppel. Staff were given nine days to complete the survey. We received a total of 93 completed questionnaires.

We cannot be sure that every member of staff working at the establishment received the email. Furthermore, because the online survey is set up to enable multiple responses from a single device (to facilitate participation by those who share computers) it is possible that individuals may have completed the questionnaire more than once. It is therefore not possible to provide an accurate response rate.

Full survey results

The full survey results for staff at HMYOI Wetherby and Keppel provide a breakdown of responses for only the structured questions. Percentages have been rounded and therefore may not add up to 100%.
