

YOI survey methodology

A confidential survey of children is carried out by HMI Prisons researchers at each YOI on an annual basis.

HMI Prisons researchers developed a short self-completion questionnaire in October 2020 to support the scrutiny visit methodology. The questionnaire is offered to every child resident in the establishment on the day of the survey. The questionnaire consists of structured questions covering key issues relating to the child's experience during the outbreak of COVID-19, together with demographic and background questions which enable us to compare responses from different subgroups of the YOI population. There is also an open question after the questions relating to safety and at the end of the questionnaire which allows children to expand on any of their responses. All written comments are typed up and provided to the inspection team.

Distributing and collecting questionnaires

HMI Prisons researchers distribute and collect the questionnaires in person. So that children can give their informed consent to participate, the purpose of the survey and the inspection is explained (for further information about the ethical principles which underpin our survey methodology, please see our website: https://www.justiceinspectorates.gov.uk/hmiprisons/about-our-inspections/research/ethical-principles-for-research/). We make clear that the questionnaire can also be administered via a face-to-face interview for those who have literacy difficulties and via a telephone translation service for those with limited English.

Children are made aware that participation in the survey is voluntary. We also explain that while they do not need to put their name on the questionnaire, individual respondents can be identified via a numbering system which is only accessible to the inspection team. This is so that any child protection and safeguarding concerns can be followed up (see section below for further information).

Children who agree to participate in the survey are provided with a sealable envelope for their completed questionnaire, which will later be collected by researchers.

Child protection and safeguarding

All completed questionnaires are checked by researchers for potential child protection and safeguarding issues on the day of the survey. Any concerns are followed up by inspectors and passed on to establishment staff if necessary.

HMYOI Wetherby

Survey response

At the time of the survey on 19 January 2021 the population at HMYOI Wetherby was 155. Using the approach described above, questionnaires were distributed to 151 children. Questionnaires were not distributed to four children who were at court on the day of the survey.

We received a total of 104 completed questionnaires, a response rate of 69%. Twenty-eight young people declined to participate in the survey and 19 questionnaires were not returned.

YOI survey results and analyses

Over the following pages we present the full survey results followed by numerous comparative analyses for HMYOI Wetherby. For the comparator analyses, where relevant, each question was reformulated using the Chi-square test (or Fisher's exact test if there are fewer than five expected counts in a cell) into a binary 'yes/no' format and affirmative responses compared. Missing responses have been excluded from all analyses and for some questions, responses from a sub-group of the sample are reported (as indicated in the data).

Results that are significantly more positive are indicated by green shading and results that are significantly more
