Accepted	A new process was introduced in May 2017 which ensures that a Cell Sharing Risk Assessment (CSRA) review is completed by the Violence Reduction (VR) team after every incident of violence or weapons, to consider whether this indicates an increased risk. 2	The Director should ensure that staff consistently follow a clear pathway for managing prisoners suspected of using NPS, that staff are vigilant for signs of its use and are briefed how to respond when prisoners appear to be under the influence of such substances	Accepted	The Drug/Recovery Strategy, including a specific section on NPS, is currently under thorough review. The strategy will outline the pathway for the management of prisoners who are suspected of using NPS, including how staff should respond when prisoners appear to be under the influence of such substances. 3	The Director should ensure that officers have meaningful contact with every prisoner through an effective personal officer scheme, which allows officers to get to know prisoners, identify their needs and make regular case history notes.	Accepted	<p>The Custodial Officer Support Scheme LOP is being reviewed, and will be published to staff when completed.</p> <p>NOMIS entries are randomly checked by PDU on a monthly basis and the results recorded and presented to SMT to ensure that staff are regularly recording their interactions with prisoners.</p> <p>The Safer Custody (SASH) team checks open ACCT books on a monthly basis to ensure that the individual's case notes have been updated.
