1	The Governor should ensure that there is an effective supply and demand reduction strategy to reduce the availability and use of illicit drugs and diverted medication.	Accepted	<p>HMP Bristol has identified reducing the supply and demand for illicit substances and articles, such as drugs and mobile phones, as one of the establishment key priorities.</p> <p>Supply reduction is led by the Head of Security, coordinated through monthly multi-disciplinary meetings. Additionally security meetings consider the current intelligence picture and agree and allocate objectives for the month ahead, which are reinforced to the wider staff team at daily operational briefings.</p> <p>A regularly reviewed risk register has been developed, focusing on preventing the ingress of illicit articles, with accountability for delivery clearly defined.</p> <p>HMP Bristol is aware of the key areas of risk for the ingress of illicit items, and adopt a range of measures to mitigate these risks. For example, regular overt and covert patrols and CCTV coverage of the internal and external perimeter of the establishment, appropriate searching and x-raying of all clothing and property on arrival, and storage of valuable items. Any medication that has arrived with the prisoner is handed to medical staff on arrival.</p> <p>Visits are a known route through which illicit items can enter prisons, and the security procedures to prevent passing of unauthorised articles during visits are set out in the Local Security Strategy. CCTV is used to identify those attempting to smuggle contraband into prison, with closed visits (where there is an identified risk of smuggling prohibited items) and visitor bans (where individuals have been found to be engaging in this activity)</p>	<p>Head of Security</p> <p>Ongoing</p>

			<p>applied where appropriate.</p> <p>HMP Bristol works in partnership with Avon and Somerset Police to identify visitors and prisoners who present a risk in terms of supply of illicit substances and articles and to put strategies in place to reduce their ability to operate. This has led to outstanding results in terms of intercepting or retrieving illicit items. This is fed into the prisons monthly multidisciplinary Security Meeting.</p> <p>Demand Reduction is driven by a multi-disciplinary Substance Misuse Strategy team to help prisoners abstain from substance misuse and to provide rehabilitative interventions, including clinical intervention, structured group work and peer support. Educational interventions have also been introduced to raise awareness of the dangers specific to these new psychoactive substances.</p> <p>The prison is currently reviewing its Substance Misuse Strategy to ensure it covers supply, demand and harm reduction and is developing an awareness and support campaign to reduce demand for Autumn 2017.</p>	<p>Head of Reducing Reoffending October 2017</p>
2	<p>The Governor should ensure prisoners who use or are suspected of using new psychoactive substances are referred to drug treatment services</p>	Accepted	<p>A Quick Time Learning Bulletin on was issued in June 2017 to remind all staff that they are required to submit a Security Information Report if they suspect a prisoner has used or is using psychoactive substances.</p> <p>The Head of Security and Security Custodial Manager undertake analysis and development of all Security Information Reports, including those relating to a prisoner testing positive during a Mandatory Drug Test. This includes a quality assurance check to ensure each report is disseminated appropriately.</p>	<p>Head of Safety Completed</p>

			<p>Relevant Security Information Reports will be disseminated to the Substance Misuse Team (SMPT) via email by the Security Department. Receipt of this information by the SMPT will be automatically treated as a referral, this will initiate a response by the SMPT in the form of a visit to the prisoner by either their allocated Case Worker or the duty SMT worker. SIRS are checked daily and allocated to SMPT workers by SMPT Managers.</p>	<p>Head of Healthcare Ongoing</p>
3	<p>The Governor should review the local security strategy and ensure that everything possible is being done to prevent mobile phones entering the prison</p>	<p>Accepted</p>	<p>In addition to the measures in place described at recommendation 1 above, all prisoners entering HMP Bristol are subject to a full search and are required to sit on the Body Orifice Security Scanner (BOSS) Chair at the point of coming into Reception.</p> <p>In addition there is a dynamic use of Corruption Prevention intelligence to identify and intercept trafficking of mobile phones into prison. Intelligence is also used to target parcels over the wall and passes through visits with the use of the regional dog team to support staff in intelligence led searching of cells and shared living spaces.</p>	<p>Head of Security Ongoing</p>
