1	The Head of Healthcare should ensure that where a patient is on multiple pain relieving medicines, there are regular structured medicine reviews.	Accepted	<p>The Head of Healthcare and Macmillan Prison Project Lead for Palliative and End of Life Care (North East) have initiated a palliative care, complex care and frailty register meeting within HMP Frankland.</p> <p>The terms of reference are designed to enable the needs and treatment of patients on the register to benefit from additional dedicated structured medicines reviews. This includes patients on multiple pain relieving medicines.</p> <p>The meetings are minuted and include the input of prescribers, dispensers, associated professionals and staff administering medicines. The work ensures that the prescribing rationale is clearly understood by all contributing to the patient's care inclusive of social care, so that clinical staff can manage the presenting risks appropriately.</p> <p>The care register meeting is scheduled monthly with any associated task group/medicines review meetings frequency determined at this meeting.</p> <p>All minutes and associated reports of the wider medicines review consultations are submitted where indicated to the care register meeting for comment, record and additional considerations/actions to be undertaken by the medical and nursing teams and associated professional as indicated.</p> <p>All new additions to the palliative care register are discussed and have their needs and interventions recorded within the minutes of the monthly care registers meeting. Attendees ensure that structured care plans are initiated early in the palliative stage of illness by a senior named nurse to ensure patient's needs are properly met and reviewed incrementally.</p>	Head of Healthcare Completed
