Accepted	<p>Following the death the Healthcare providers held a clinical review which ensured that nursing staff were verbally briefed to remind them of the NHS England and HM Prisons and Probation Service guidance, published in September 2016, which clarified that it is inappropriate to commence cardiopulmonary resuscitation when rigor mortis is present.</p> <p>Notice to Staff 303/16 was issued in December 2016 to remind all staff of the guidance.</p>	<p>Head of Healthcare Head of Safer Custody Completed</p>
2	The Governor should ensure, in line with PSI 08/2010, that all staff, including healthcare staff, are debriefed appropriately after a potentially traumatic incident or death, and that they are offered support.	Accepted	In August 2017 the Senior Management Team were issued with guidance notes on hot debriefs and post incident stress. The Head of Safer Custody will also remind all operational managers via email, by the end of August 2017, that every effort should be made to ensure that all staff involved in a potentially traumatic incident are given the opportunity to attend the debrief and that where this is not possible, those staff must be spoken to by the operational manager at the earliest possible opportunity to ensure appropriate support is offered.	<p>Head of Safer Custody August 2017</p>
