1	The Director should ensure there is effective implementation of the prison's substance misuse strategy to help reduce the availability of, and demand for New Psychoactive Substances.	Accepted	<p>There have been a number of actions taken by the Director to reduce the availability of and demand for psychoactive substances. In December 2016 the main route for psychoactive substances coming in to the establishment was objects being throw over wall, in response to which netting has been placed over all exercises yards.</p> <p>Joint working (sharing learning and risk management) has been agreed with the local police, HMP Featherstone and HMP Brinsford to stop the use of drones.</p> <p>Mandatory Drug Testing is now available to test for psychoactive substances and it is now illegal to be found in custody with psychoactive substances.</p> <p>In June HMP Oakwood introduced a drug support unit where prisoners who are dependent on psychoactive substances can receive intensive intervention and support. Referrals are made following been placed on report for MDT failures or self-referrals are also accepted.</p>	Completed Deputy Director
