1	The Heads of Healthcare at HMP Elmley and HMP Stanford Hill should ensure that prompt action is taken to address abnormal test results, including when prisoners with potentially serious abnormalities do not attend follow-up appointments.	Accepted	<p>HMP Elmley have in place a weekly nurse led clinic to review complex patients this includes those with life limiting illnesses. Patients that are moved across sites will be supported by the identified lead nurse to ensure continuity of care.</p> <p>HMP Stanford Hill will have a named GP, who will be allocated to review all electronic blood results and all other paperwork each day and will be responsible for any further actions that need to be taken</p> <p>This means that prompt action will be taken to address abnormal test results.</p> <p>In the event where a patient does not attend for a booked review the GP or lead nurse will review the purpose of the appointment and advise whether the patient warrants a “ home visit” or advise on the date of next follow up as appropriate</p>	<p>January 2018</p> <p>Integrated Care 24 limited</p>
