1	The Head of Healthcare should review the criteria to determine end of life and issue guidance to all medical staff.	Accepted	<p>A “Tri-Partite Palliative Care Unit Operating Manual” will be published by HMP Leyhill in consultation with Inspire Better Health and South Gloucestershire Council, which will include guidance on the progression to the palliative care unit, staff roles and responsibilities, and the compassionate release process.</p> <p>An end of life pathway for prisoners requiring palliative care at HMP Leyhill will be developed and will set out the criteria to determine end of life in line with The Gold Standards end of life prognostic indicator guidance (2011), which will be cascaded to all healthcare staff and include an agreed end of life care algorithm.</p> <p>Training will be delivered to all healthcare staff by the Healthcare Manager and lead GP on how to complete the end of life pathway. This training will also remind staff of the need to initiate discussions with the prisoner to assist their care planning and establish the prisoner’s wishes, in order to support both the prisoners and their families.</p> <p>Implementation of the pathway will be led and audited by the Healthcare Manager who will also review the end of life care plans.</p> <p>Healthcare staff will attend relevant St Peter’s Hospice workshops to meet any identified training/learning needs.
