1	The Governor should ensure there are effective supply and demand reduction strategies to help reduce the availability of illicit substances, including the trafficking of prescription medication, and that staff are vigilant to signs of their use and know how to respond when a prisoner appears to be under the influence of such substances.	Accepted	<p>The supply reduction strategy is currently under review, with the review focusing on the prevention of illicit items entering the establishment in conjunction with the detection of such items. Physical security has been improved by the use of further CCTV, window grilles and additional fence lines to protect the perimeter wall.</p> <p>MDT results for the past 12 months have been scrutinised and the positive drug tests attributable to misuse of prescribed medication has been negligible however the medical staff at the point of issue will be reminded of the need to be vigilant to the possibility of secretion of medication to be trafficked at a future time.</p> <p>A notice to staff will be issued reminding all staff of their responsibilities during an incident were a prisoner is or appears to be under the influence of a substance.</p>	<p>September 2017</p> <p>Head of Safer Custody Head of Operations Head of Healthcare</p>
2	The Governor should ensure that all prison staff are made aware of and understand PSI 03/2013, Medical Emergency Response Codes, and their responsibilities during medical emergencies which ensures a medical emergency code is used.	Accepted	Notice to staff 308/2016, which sets out the required actions and response codes for staff during a medical emergency, was reissued in July 2017 and will be re-iterated at staff morning briefings.
