1	The Head of Healthcare should ensure that clinicians consider a prisoner's overall symptoms in a holistic manner, so that any indicators of disease progression are quickly acted upon.	Accepted	This would be an expectation of any member of healthcare staff that is carrying out a patient assessment. Both the screenings and signposting for treatment include auto-referrals which trigger further treatment, request specialist input or flag up the need for appointments. These sit as tasks on the system so are acted on as part of normal protocol. The task list is monitored daily. Clinicians have been reminded by e-mail instructions of the requirement to consider a prisoner's overall symptoms.	Complete Head of Healthcare
2	The Head of Healthcare should ensure that care plans are developed and regularly reviewed for all chronic conditions, particularly where frequent requests for medication are made.	Accepted	All patients who have chronic or long-term conditions identified now have a care plan request generated automatically. This is completed and is 'read' coded on the system. During this process, review dates are entered and are flagged when due.	Complete Head of Healthcare
3	The Head of Healthcare should ensure that multi-disciplinary meetings are held at regular frequency in cases where a prisoner has complex conditions and multiple prescriptions for medication.	Accepted	There are three multi-disciplinary forums currently active at HMP Hewell as follows: 1. The prison co-ordinated SCP (supporting Complex Prisoners) meeting which is held weekly. 2. Healthcare Multi-disciplinary Team meeting – mainly a focus on mental health and the in-patients unit, held weekly. 3 MPCCC (Multi-Professional Complex Case Conference) a GP led healthcare forum to discuss complex health needs.
