1	The Head of Healthcare should ensure that cardiovascular risk assessments are offered to all prisoners aged over 40 with relevant risk factors, in line with NICE guidance.	Accepted	From January 2018 HMP Elmley provides weekly NHS cardiovascular risk assessment clinics for prisoners over 40 in line with NICE guidance and as part of the Health and Justice indicators of performance. Patients will be called back annually as a minimum for a review as per NICE guidance. The data and Governance manager updates prisoners who are eligible monthly and these prisoners are added to the waiting list for assessment. National Health Service for England oversees and audits compliance in this area	Complete Head of Healthcare
2	The Head of Healthcare should ensure that GPs complete a medication review when prisoners return from hospital. Checks should be made to ensure that prisoners have the correct items of medication in-possession.	Accepted	<p>From January 2018 the following has been implemented, HMPS colleagues will ensure all offenders returning are seen and assessed by the reception nurse, or if out of hours by Hotel 1 (emergency response nurse). A referral will be made to the GP for a following day review for anyone returning from hospital with a change in medication. The face to face appointment will ensure that:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• We have checked the patients understanding of the change in medication;</li> <li>• We have informed the need for the patient to return any old stock; and</li> <li>• All necessary follow up appointments for review including GP reviews and blood tests/ECGs are made at the same time.</li> </ul> <p>The new prescription will be processed by the pharmacy team. The old prescription will be removed and a request made, by the pharmacy team, to the house block nurse to return medications from the old script. This removes the risk of both old and new scripts running concurrently.</p>	Complete Head of Healthcare

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			<p>On returning from External Hospital appointments / Hospital Bedwatch the Operational Supervisory Officer / Custodial Manager of Reception will enquire with the escorting staff on returning to the establishment if they had any medication or prescription issued as part of booking in process. They are then directed to the reception nurse or duty nurse manager after hours to check the medication presented and a decision is made on possession and issuing of medication by medical staff.</p>
