A number of actions have already been addressed – for example</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • A pilot of 24/7 healthcare provision at HMP Stafford commenced on the 15th October 2018 and will be closely reviewed over the coming months, with the option to extend the pilot should it prove beneficial. • Increased Pharmacist hours to undertaken Medication Reviews, focusing specifically on polypharmacy (concurrent use of multiple medications) commenced on 10th September 2018. <p>The implementation of a new national mental health service specification in April 2019 will include utilising a trauma-informed approach when working with patients.</p> <p>Veteran Health and Dementia Care for HMP Stafford will be within NHS England's commissioning intentions for 2019/2020. Development/scoping work will continue during 2018 to understand the best approach to meeting these needs for patients at HMP Stafford.</p> <p>A multiagency project team is looking at the feasibility of piloting an enhanced health and social care service at HMP Stafford. Feasibility has been accessed and estates requirements are being discussed with HMPPS. Health and social care needs have been identified and costed and a business case to fund the service is being developed.
