5	The Governor and Head of Healthcare should ensure that all staff undertaking risk assessments for prisoners taken to hospital understand the legal position on the use of restraints and that assessments fully take into account the health of a prisoner and are based on the actual risk the prisoner presents at the time.	Accepted	<p>All healthcare staff have received training in the consideration and recording of medical information for the purposes of completing risk assessments for escort. Modelled assessments have been provided to assist with understanding and an escalation process implemented should someone be unsure of what is required.</p> <p>The national guidance has been reissued to all staff, including the Duty Governors who make the final decision on the need for restraints. A Notice to Staff has been issued to both prison and healthcare staff regarding the need to ensure that risk assessments are in place, kept up to date, and that they therefore comply with the Safer Custody Bulletin April 2016 Issue 8 'Emergency Response and the Use of Restraints'.</p>	Head of Healthcare Complete Head of Residence and Safety Complete
