1	The Head of Healthcare should ensure that GPs automatically see and create care plans for prisoners returning from hospital with new diagnoses and treatments.	Accepted	Since Mr Ajidahun's death, the healthcare provider at HMP Chelmsford has changed. The new provider Essex Partnership University Trust (EPUT) have reminded staff via email, and this will be discussed again in staff handover, staff supervision and in team meetings, that all patients returning from hospital with a new diagnosis are automatically booked to see a GP on their return and care plans devised which include treatments and diagnosis. 2	The Head of Healthcare should create Supported Living Plans and share these with prison staff where appropriate.	Accepted	Since Mr Ajidahun's death, the healthcare provider at HMP Chelmsford has changed. The new provider Essex Partnership University Trust is in the process of liaising with HMP Parc and NHS England to get further information on Supported Living Plans in order to introduce this recommendation. 3	The Governor should ensure that prisoners wishing to use the gym complete and sign a PAR-Q as part of their induction in line with PSI 58/2011.	Accepted	All prisoners must now complete their gym induction prior to commencing their three day induction into prison life. This system now has a more robust form of recording and monitoring system, which allows staff to accurately record whether a prisoner has completed the gym induction. As part of this induction every prisoner has to complete and sign a PAR-Q which are now recorded and retained. Depending on the answers given on the PAR-Q, it can be sent to healthcare for an assessment and feedback is given to the gym. Once the whole gym induction including the PAR-Q has been completed the prisoners ID cards are stamped to show this and only prisoners with stamped cards will be permitted to use the gym. 4	The Governor and the Head of Healthcare should ensure all staff are familiar with and understand the emergency code protocol.	Accepted	The current emergency code protocol is being changed to fall in line with the code Red and code Blue adopted by other prison establishments. All staff will be fully briefed in the new protocol via verbal briefings, formal notices and pocket size guidance pamphlet prior to the new system going live.
