Oxleas NHS Foundation Trust governance leads are currently reviewing the training arrangement (13.12.2018) with a view to ensuring that all or some of the nursing staff are trained to Immediate Life Support (ILS) level to better prepare staff and enhance the care patients receive in emergency situations.</p> <p>Emergency equipment is located in various areas around the prison including Defibrillators in each of these sites which are fully accessible.
