However this process will be reviewed by Head of Healthcare to ensure compliance in meeting the prisoner's needs. The treatment and management of prisoners diagnosed with life threatening conditions (such as cancer) to become an agenda item within bi-weekly Healthcare team meetings identifying any action points.</p> <p>In instances where night pain management is required, arrangements are made to transfer the prisoner to an appropriate facility - L Wing at HMP Norwich or the local hospital via consultation with relevant stakeholders including the prisoner.</p>	Dec 2017 Head of Healthcare

The Healthcare provider will liaise with the Security Department to provide a list of those prisoners where their health issues would have an impact on the risk assessment. This list will include all prisoners who are:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Seriously ill • Frail/lacking mobility • Have a terminal diagnosis <p>This will provide an assumption that restraints are not to be used unless there is a specific reason to override this, which will have to be justified and recorded by the manager responsible.</p> <p>The risk assessment process will be reviewed with a view to changing the tick box process undertaken by the nursing staff. This currently asks if there are any medical objections to restraints being used, rather than commenting on the 3 elements recorded above which will need to be added to the assessment to enable the responsible manager to make a considered judgement.</p> <p>Further, as part of the risk assessment advice will be sought from wing staff where available as they will often have a better understanding of the day to day mobility issues.</p> <p>This list will be updated regularly to take into account the health of the prisoners in our care.</p>	<p>Head of Security & Head of Healthcare</p>
