1	The Head of Healthcare at HMP Leicester should ensure that all patients taking anti-psychotic medication have at least a yearly physical health check in line with NICE guidance.	Accepted	<p>In line with NICE (National Institute of Health and Care Excellence) guidance, the Head of Healthcare will ensure that physical health checks for those patients on anti-psychotic medications are carried out annually and a register of patients is also maintained on SystmOne which automatically lets healthcare staff know when these checks were last completed. A check on when prisoners last received their physical health check, including what medication they are on, will also be identified at the reception screening process, and appointments made for those who require it. All healthcare and reception staff were reminded about these checks at the weekly staff meeting in April 2019.</p> <p>Since August 2018 there has been a weekly metabolic monitoring clinic at HMP Leicester. The health screening checks completed at the clinic, assess the impact that the anti-psychotic medication is having on the patient, and if there are any adverse effects requiring the medication to be changed. The pharmacy team also produce a weekly report to note which patients need to be prescribed anti-psychotic medication. These patients are then offered an appointment. All patients at the clinic will be invited for an annual check.</p>	Head of Healthcare Completed
2	The Head of Healthcare at HMP Featherstone should ensure that all staff who carry out reception screenings refer patients with abnormal clinical findings to the appropriate clinician.	Accepted	A training session will be delivered in April 2019 to all healthcare staff who are responsible for carrying out reception screenings, to refresh them about what constitutes abnormal observations and the importance of referring the patient to the appropriate clinician if abnormal observations are found.
