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| 1 | The Head of Healthcare should ensure that prisoners are assessed for cardiac risk factors in line with NICE guidelines. | Accepted | All prisoners transferred to HMP Onley are now assessed in reception using a comprehensive screening tool. The screening asks specific questions regarding existing heart problems and related risk factors. Prisoners on current medication for any condition are seen by the GP within two weeks. Prisoners unable to attend allocated clinic appointments due to visits or adjudications are provided with alternative appointments and re-booked to ensure they are assessed for cardiac risk factors in line with NICE guidelines. | Head of Healthcare Completed |
| 2 | The Governor and Head of Healthcare should ensure that there is an effective protocol in place so all staff are aware of how to respond when a prisoner reports sudden chest pain. | Accepted | <p>A Governor's Order relating to the appropriate use of 'code blue code red' procedures was published in February 2017 with a published policy with clear guidance for staff on how to respond to prisoners reporting chest pains, including actions for communications of staff in line with PPO recommendations and national guidelines.</p> <p>Compliance with procedures are now monitored through the Safety Programme at HMP Onley. Management assurance checks are taking place to confirm staff understanding on emergency responses.</p> | Deputy Governor and Healthcare Completed |
| 3 | The Governor should ensure that prisoners identified as using illicit drugs, including NPS, are referred to drug treatment services and that there is an active response to security intelligence, as part of an effective drug supply reduction strategy. | Accepted | <p>A refreshed drug strategy is being developed as part of a wider local Safety Programme. This strategy will be informed by a local Healthcare Need Analysis and intelligence of substance misuse within the establishment. The strategy will seek to support men and signpost them to drug misuse services.</p> <p>As part of a wider residential review, we are also seeking to improve the services and support offered with our partner Phoenix Futures. A review of the internal drug testing framework will be undertaken to ensure that we are more proactive and intelligent in managing drug information and diverting</p> | Head of Safer Custody, Head of Security and Head of Healthcare. | 4 | The Governor should ensure that, when a cell door is unlocked, officers satisfy themselves of the wellbeing of the prisoner and that there are no immediate issues that need attention. | Accepted | <p>A Governor’s Order (004/2017) has been published (7 February 2017) to remind staff of the requirement to satisfy themselves of a prisoner’s wellbeing when a cell door is unlocked.</p> <p>Management visits take place during unlock periods to ensure the wellbeing of prisoners. Staff briefings and dedicated security/safety training also include the requirement that staff check the wellbeing of all prisoners during unlock.</p> <p>Recommendations from PPO reports are added to the establishment PPO action plan and form part of the minutes of the Safer Prisons meeting that are available to all staff.</p> | Deputy Governor Completed |
