1	The Governor should ensure that, as part of an effective drug strategy, there is an active response to security intelligence, and that prisoners suspected of taking illicit drugs are effectively treated and monitored	Accepted	<p>The Drug Supply Reduction Strategy was written and introduced in April 2018. The Strategy includes a section relating to security intelligence which promotes the importance of using accurate and timely intelligence to inform decisions regarding the best use of resources to ensure there is an active response to available information. The principal aim of this analysis is to identify “Known Dealers”, supply routes, hiding places and drug use areas. Security Intelligence is extracted from all available information streams.</p> <p>The Security Department’s aim is to provide a deterrent to those engaged in drug supply, as well as to improve analysis of security intelligence so that appropriate monitoring can take place. They are responsible for collating intelligence with regard to the drug market within the prison, including current threats and supply routes and acting upon this information. This work is supported through Monthly Security Committee meetings, the Monthly Security Intelligence meeting, Monthly Security Objectives and the Weekly Intelligence Bulletin.</p> <p>Additionally the monthly Security Intelligence Briefings provides detailed analysis of all drug related intelligence, including prisoners involved, drug and mobile phone finds and trafficking routes.</p> <p>If prisoners are displaying signs, symptoms and/or suspected of being under the influence of a substance staff will request immediate support, including medical assistance. The appropriate referral to the substance misuse team will then be made.</p>	Head of Security Completed
