1	The Head of Healthcare should ensure that staff set up care plans for the management of long-term conditions.	Accepted	<p>Since Mr Bailey’s death there have been discussions around the locality of prisoners and their management of long-term conditions. Respective roles of staff in the inpatient unit and Long term condition (LTC) clinic have been clarified and the LTC clinic is managed by a senior nurse who is aware of this process and is competent in the implementation and review of care plans.</p> <p>Additionally, a regular, monthly audit of care plans is undertaken and any issues fed back and discussed via head of healthcare and primary care managers.</p>	<p>Complete</p> <p>Head of Healthcare</p>
2	The Head of Healthcare should ensure that abnormal blood test results are actioned appropriately and promptly.	Accepted	<p>All blood tests are reviewed regularly / Daily (except Sunday) and actioned according to urgency. Weekly screening figures are also circulated that highlight any prisoner blood tests and blood test results.</p> <p>There is a governance structure in place to review these processes and there is a monthly GP meeting attended by MDT members and this process will be reviewed at next planned meeting (07.2019) so as to ensure that abnormal blood tests are actioned promptly.</p>	<p>July 2019</p> <p>Head of Healthcare</p>
3	The Governor and Head of Healthcare should ensure that all staff undertaking risk assessments for prisoners taken to hospital understand the legal position on the use of restraints and that assessments fully take into account the health of a prisoner and are based on	Accepted	<p>All hospital escort risk assessments are completed with an accurate reflection of the prisoner’s well-being and relevant condition that takes into account any potential use of restraints. Before any hospital escort is sent out a governor grade must approve, ensuring the Graham judgement principles have been considered. The signing governor will also document why the decision has been made referring to the Graham judgement.</p> <p>All staff involved in the risk assessment process were instructed of the above in April 2019.
