1	The Head of Healthcare at HMP Hull should ensure that high blood pressure is promptly and appropriately investigated and treated in line with current clinical guidelines.	Accepted	<p>The Head of Healthcare reminded all healthcare staff at a clinical team meeting in January 2017 that they should ensure that high blood pressure is promptly and appropriately investigated and treated in line with current clinical guidelines. The recall system for prisoners who do not attend appointments was updated in December 2016 so staff can automatically recall patients who do not attend appointments. All patients will now also be recalled annually for a blood pressure test.</p> <p>A Long Term Conditions Pathway for Hypertension was discussed at a clinical team meeting in December 2016. Following this, a refresher training session for all nursing staff on dealing with prisoners with high blood pressure and hypertension will be held on 17 February 2017.</p>	Head of Healthcare HMP Hull Completed
2	The Governor at HMP Warren Hill should ensure that, when a cell door is unlocked, officers satisfy themselves of the wellbeing of the prisoner and that there are no immediate issues that need attention.	Accepted	<p>A Governor's Notice to Staff was issued in December 2016 to remind staff of their responsibilities when unlocking cell doors, and that they must receive a response from the prisoner to ensure their well-being and to satisfy themselves that there are no immediate issues that need attention.</p> <p>Wing dairies were reviewed in December 2016 and have been annotated on the unlocking signature section to now read: "Prisoner checked by unit staff. Verbal response confirmed". This recommendation will be closely monitored by the Head of Residential Services.</p>	Governor Head of Residential Services Completed
