Accepted	<p>All mental health nursing staff have now completed the Greater Manchester Mental Health Care Programme Approach (CPA) training.</p> <p>Staff have been reminded during briefings by the Team Manager that all prisoners under the care of the mental health service must have an up-to-date care plan in place which makes clear the objectives that have been set. The need for regular documented contact and reviews with their caseworker has also been reiterated to all staff.</p> <p>Staff compliance with these expectations is managed through regular supervision and appraisal.</p>	Mental Health Team Manager Completed

This training is being delivered through the Knowledge and Understanding Framework (KUF). Other sources of training are also being reviewed. The training reiterates the requirement for an Initial Assessment Interview to be held within 24 hours of an ACCT being opened and that this must be multidisciplinary. In addition the Group Safer Custody Team have recently delivered caremap training to all Operational Band 4 and Band 5's.</p> <p>The Safer Living Team has also sent by email to all staff, a Local Guide to Caremaps, as well as a PowerPoint presentation outlining the actions that must be followed within the first hour and first 24 hours of the opening of an ACCT document.</p> <p>Compliance with these procedures are checked on a daily basis by the Wing Manager and also by the Duty Governor.</p> <p>The Night Orderly Officer also conducts a weekly ACCT management check on all open ACCT documents. A further 10% are checked by the Head of Safer Living and the Equalities Custodial Manager on a monthly basis.</p>
