1	<p>The Governor and Head of Healthcare should ensure that all staff undertaking risk assessments for prisoners taken to hospital understand the legal position on the use of restraints and that assessments fully take into account the health of a prisoner and are based on the actual risk the prisoner presents at the time.</p>	Accepted	<p>Every prisoner that is taken to hospital will always firstly have a comprehensive risk assessment completed. The risk assessment always goes to a member of the HealthCare team initially who will record any physical ailments or restrictions that the Governor must be made aware of. This is taken into account when the Governor makes the decision of what the cuffing arrangements should be.</p> <p>All staff therefore understand the legal position on the use of restraints and that assessments must take into account the actual risk(s) the prisoner poses at the time.</p> <p>All relevant staff will be reminded in March 2019 of the legal position on the use of restraints and in particular the assessment must take account of actual risk(s).</p> <p>It has been agreed that a training session will be created and delivered in May 2019 to Healthcare staff on how to complete risk assessments for patients going to hospital.
