1	The Head of Healthcare and Head of Security should develop a protocol for an open-door policy to allow healthcare staff urgent access to prisoners during the night state	Accepted	The establishment will develop an open-door policy with input from Healthcare and Safer Custody. 2	The Head of Healthcare should explore the availability of battery operated nebulisers for prisoners with chronic lung problems who require regular external appointments	Accepted	For all future cases such as this, the prisoner's named nurse will make contact with their consultant. If clinically indicated to have further equipment provided this will be requested through the local trust.	January 2020 Head of Healthcare
3	The Head of Healthcare and the Head of Safer Custody should ensure that the ACCT process is not used for long term health monitoring	Accepted	Guidance will be circulated to the clinical team around appropriateness of opening an ACCT to monitor health concerns. This will be done via the MPCCC (multi professional complex case clinic) and a plan of care put in place via S1. This guidance will be replicated in a Notice to Staff sent to all operational staff working at HMP Long Lartin. SASH training will be provided for Healthcare staff to ensure that they are familiar with the ACCT document and its purpose.	February 2020 Head of Healthcare & Head of Safer Custody
4	The Head of Healthcare should ensure the waiting times for access to Psychology specialists are monitored against NHS standards	Accepted	This is monitored against NHS standards monthly via the Performance Dashboard and Health and Justice Indicators of Performance.
