1	The Governor and Head of Healthcare should ensure that staff consistently implement Haverigg's policy for managing prisoners suspected of using PS and other illegal substances and ensure that members of staff appropriately record and share information, particularly about potential risk.	Accepted	A notice to staff will be issued in October 2018 providing a reminder of the procedures to be followed when managing prisoners who are suspected of using psychoactive substances (PS) and other illegal substances. This will include the need to record and share information appropriately particularly around potential risk. A review of the current strategy for tackling the use of PS will also be undertaken. This will commence in November 2018 and will include input from key stakeholders. Findings from the review will be used to enhance current practices.	Head of Safety/ Head of Healthcare January 2019
2	The Governor should ensure that all prison staff are aware of the correct roll check procedures and that, when a cell door is unlocked, staff satisfy themselves of prisoners' wellbeing and that there are no immediate issues that need attention.	Accepted	<p>Learning bulletin issue 6 of 2015 (checking the welfare of prisoners) was re - issued to all staff in March 2018 providing a reminder of the necessary requirements when carrying out welfare checks, including at night. This also included a reminder of the need to ensure that when unlocking cells, staff satisfy themselves of the safety and welfare of the prisoner and that there are no immediate issues that need attention. A further reissue of the bulletin will take place by November 2018.</p> <p>These requirements will be reiterated to staff during regular staff briefings and by unit managers as part of their daily briefings. This issue will also be discussed at Safer Custody meetings.</p>	Head of Safety November 2018
