1	<p>The Head of Healthcare should ensure that clinical staff assess and manage prisoners with deteriorating chronic conditions effectively to enable good standards of care, including that clinical staff:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• use appropriate assessment and monitoring processes to monitor and record vital signs; and</li> <li>• receive up-to-date training in using National Early Warning Scores and are aware of the triggers for escalation.</li> </ul>	Accepted	<p>The Head of Healthcare will ensure that prisoners with deteriorating chronic conditions are assessed effectively to ensure good standards of care by;</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• ensuring that all clinical staff utilise the National Early Warning Scores (NEWS) which is available for clinical staff within the System One and are aware of the triggers for escalation.</li> <li>• That the use of NEWS scores is now incorporated in Immediate Life Support Training undertaken by all clinical staff.</li> </ul> <p>Clinical staff will be reminded regularly at MDT meetings, from June 2019, of the requirement to utilise appropriate assessment and monitoring processes to monitor and record vital signs, including the use of NEWS and to be aware of the triggers for escalation.</p>	<p>Complete Head of Healthcare</p>
2	<p>The Head of Healthcare should ensure that healthcare staff appropriately assess prisoners at risk of falls in line with NICE guidelines and that their assessment is recorded and acted on.</p>	Accepted	<p>A member of the healthcare staff has completed Otago training in June 2019 which is an exercise programme designed specifically to prevent falls.</p> <p>The Head of Healthcare will also ensure that healthcare staff are reminded regularly at MDT meetings of the need for all staff to complete the Falls Risk Assessment Template which is available on System One and act on the information gained.</p>	<p>Complete Head of Healthcare</p>

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3	The Head of Healthcare must ensure that healthcare staff record all relevant information on the medical escort risk assessment form, including information about decisions and orders not to resuscitate prisoners.	Accepted	The Medical section of the Escort Risk Assessment was amended in June 2019 to include a section on DNAR. This will ensure that this information is communicated and recorded for all escorts.	Complete Head of Healthcare
