1	The Head of Healthcare should review the approach to the management of epilepsy at Wandsworth and ensure that healthcare staff have an appropriate approach to planning the care of prisoners with epilepsy in line with National Institute for Health and Care Excellence (NICE) guidelines.	Accepted	<p>The Head of Healthcare reviewed the management of epilepsy in conjunction with a review of the management of Long Term Conditions in February 2020.</p> <p>The introduction of the Health & Wellbeing model of healthcare is currently being put in place.</p> <p>SystemOne templates have been altered to ensure that Long Term Conditions including Epilepsy are identified and managed appropriately (February 2020).</p> <p>Prisoners with long term conditions including epilepsy are identified on First Night in Custody and critical medication is prescribed and administered in Reception.</p> <p>A review of Reception processes is underway in preparation for the Health & Wellbeing model of healthcare and to ensure that there are no circumstances in which critical medication could be missed in First Night in Custody.</p> <p>A Long Term Conditions nurse has been recruited to monitor chronic conditions including epilepsy in accordance with NICE guidelines, and is expected to be in post in March 2020.
