1	<p>The Operational Manager for Offender Health should ensure that healthcare staff:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • appropriately assess prisoners returning to prison from court following a change in status; • offer all prisoners a full general health screen within a week of their arrival in line with PSO 3050; • manage prisoners with long-term health conditions in line with National Institute of Clinical Excellence guidelines and create appropriate care plans; and • receive training to help detect and treat early warning signs of deterioration in prisoners with long-term health conditions. 	Accepted	<p>Continuity of Care Standard Operating Procedures for understanding of movement through prison and the responsibilities within healthcare delivery has been reviewed to ensure that every man is appropriately assessed when returning from court.</p> <p>In addition all prisoners returning from court will also have a slip attached to their record identifying that there has been a change in circumstances, so the nurse screening them is aware and that they should be assessed accordingly.</p> <p>These processes have been extended to all prisoners that have had a change in custodial status during a video link conference at the establishment. They will be taken from the video link to Reception, where they will receive appropriate screening.</p> <p>There are identified lead nurses established for all long term conditions and have been given extra training. Weekly long term conditions clinic were introduced in November 2018, in addition we have also set up a monthly Complex care meeting which is multidisciplinary in order to ensure best care for all patients.</p> <p>We have reviewed long term conditions Standard Operating Procedures and pathways and delivered training for primary care staff in November 2018. This reinforced understanding of use of NEW2 and will be used collaboratively with other evidence based assessments The NICE baseline audits for all long term conditions are under review.</p>	<p>September 2019</p> <p>Head of Healthcare and Head of Operations</p>

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2	The Governor should ensure that a member of Prison Service staff informs a prisoner's next of kin of their death in line with national instructions.		<p>The requirements of informing a prisoner's next of kin of their death promptly have been reiterated to relevant staff. All Duty Governor's will be briefed at the Senior Leaders Team meeting on 18/09/19 that when no contact can be made we will persist with contact and record all attempts in doing so, in order for them to be made aware at the earliest opportunity. This includes utilising other Prisons FLO's or Police where it is long distance to next of kin.</p> <p>We check via NOMIS for all prisoners who do not have a next of kin listed and they are sent a form to complete in order to ensure that we have an emergency contact for everyone.</p> <p>In addition, we will also send out a reminder to all prisoners who have been at HMP Hull more than one year to check that their Next of Kin details are correct. We will add to the agenda of the complex care meeting next of kin to ensure that any men who are terminally ill have next of kin information addressed prior to this becoming necessary in case of death.</p>	<p>October 2019</p> <p>Head of Residence & Safety</p>
