1	The Director should ensure that prisoners' next of kin details are kept up to date and are readily available if they become seriously ill.	Accepted	On arrival to Oakwood all resident are asked to update their next of kin details. To ensure the prison hold the most update details of next of kin Oakwood Safer Custody Team send out a notice to residents yearly, requesting them to update the next of kin details. It is the responsibility of the resident to update their personal details. When a resident becomes unwell they are asked if the next of kin details on file are correct, if they have changed they are updated. Going forward a record with be kept on the residents case notes to confirmed if they wish for they family to be kept informed.	Complete Head of Safer Custody
2	The Director and Head of Healthcare should liaise with the Medical Director for Care UK to ensure that a clear and effective pathway is developed to help prisoners with dementia access care home placements promptly when appropriate.	Accepted	Local authorities in both England and Wales are responsible for assessing and meeting the care and support needs of all adults within their geographical area – this includes responsibility for assessing and meeting the eligible social care and support needs of adult prisoners detained in prisons which are within a local authority's area and also responsibility for assessing and meeting the eligible social care and support needs of residents of approved premises within the local authority's area and/or people who move from their usual home and are within a local authorities area as a condition of bail in criminal proceedings.
