Accepted	<p>The Head of Healthcare will ensure the Graham judgement and actions are embedded within the team.</p> <p>All staff undertaking risk assessment are to be briefed by the Head of Operations and provided with a copy of the Graham Judgment regarding part 9 of the escort risk assessment – Analysis of Assessment. It is this part that highlights the use of restraints on the terminally ill or seriously ill prisoner must be at all times.</p> <p>A section of the lessons learnt Bulletin will focus on the Graham Judgement and give advice and guidance to staff.</p> <p>A review by the Head of Security has begun.
