1	<p>The Head of Healthcare should ensure that prisoners who refuse to take their prescribed medication are discussed regularly at the multidisciplinary team meeting and their mental capacity is assessed regularly and documented in their medical record.</p>	Accepted	<p>Refusal of medication is discussed at daily multidisciplinary (MDT) lunchtime meeting and minutes of the meeting are taken. Mental capacity assessment is assessed and documented in the medical record.</p> <p>Missed dose audits are undertaken on a weekly basis by the Pharmacy team and referrals are made to GP / Prescriber.</p>	<p>Complete</p> <p>Head of Healthcare</p>
2	<p>The Governor and Head of Healthcare should ensure that staff:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• are aware of prisoners with Do Not Attempt Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation (DNACPR) orders in place;</li> <li>• understand the DNACPR policy; and</li> <li>• do not start CPR against prisoners' wishes.</li> </ul>	Accepted	<p>The Primary Care Palliative Care Lead Nurse is responsible for ensuring that the DNACPR list of patients is kept accurate and up to date. This is submitted and shared with the Prison Safer Custody Team. The orderly office holds the original in the safe and copies are given by healthcare to Safer Custody, wing staff and to the patient. Healthcare retain a copy on their file.
