1	The Head of Healthcare should ensure that staff complete and implement end of life care plans where appropriate.	Accepted	The Head of Healthcare will discuss this recommendation with the healthcare team to review the care plan process and ensure end of life care plans are implemented and reviewed. Staff to follow Dying Well in Custody guidance and recommendations.	30 September 2019 Head of Healthcare
2	The Governor and Head of Healthcare should ensure that all staff undertaking risk assessments for prisoners taken to hospital understand the legal position on the use of restraints and that assessments fully take into account the health of a prisoner and are based on the actual risk the prisoner presents at the time.	Accepted	The Head of Healthcare will discuss this recommendation with the healthcare team. Healthcare staff to ensure the prisoners clinical condition is clearly documented within the risk assessment form, to support the hand cuffing arrangements and decision making process. Authorising Governors will be contacted and made aware of the Graham Judgement and the considerations that must be given for the use of restraints taking into account the health of the prisoner.	30 September 2019 Head of Healthcare 31 July 2019 Head of Safer Custody
3	The Governor should revise the prison's escort risk assessment form so it requires prison staff to show that they have taken into account the health of the prisoner in assessing their current level of risk, and should send the Ombudsman a copy of the revised form.	Accepted	The current risk assessment does provide the opportunity for the Healthcare Department to make comments on the health and mobility of the prisoner in question. This is considered by the Custody Manager and the Governor when decisions regarding the need and appropriateness of restraints are made. The issue of ensuring that there is a sufficient level of detail about a prisoner's health will be discussed with the Head of Healthcare and improvements will be made. A new section has been added to the current escort risk assessment and also the bed watch risk assessment (in July 2019) that further assesses the mobility and age of the prisoner. This, along with the healthcare information, should allow for more proportionate and decent restraint decisions to be made.	Complete Governor/Head of Safer Custody
