1	The Head of Healthcare should ensure that prisoners with long-term conditions are referred to the long-term conditions clinic and monitored regularly.	Accepted	<p>A pathway has been implemented to support the care needed for patients with long term conditions.</p> <p>Patients will be booked into Long Term Condition (LTC) review clinic. Quality and Outcomes Framework (QOF) template will be completed and review booked in 6 months. LTC report can be run to collate data or use the QOF indicators which will flag up if patients need to be seen sooner.</p> <p>A LTC audit is being developed. This will be reviewed quarterly and staff will be offered clinical supervision.</p> <p>Care plans will also be created for each patient. Care plans are regularly audited through patient record keeping audits and information is then shared with practitioners. Lessons learnt will be shared with the wider team if themes and trends picked up. Areas needing training will be identified.</p>	Head of healthcare	<p>Complete</p> <p>February 2022</p>



2	The Head of Healthcare should ensure that prisoners who test positive for COVID-19 and are obese, are closely monitored and have their observations taken regularly.	Accepted	All patients who are obese will be monitored using the national early warning tool. There will also be a patient care plan created using Ardens. Reports will be run monthly to identify the numbers of patients with monitoring needs. This will be used in comparison to a dip test of patients with positive Covid-19 symptoms and will be used to provide assurances of care is being met.	Head of Healthcare	February 2022
3	The Head of Healthcare should ensure that staff are fully competent in the NEWS scoring system and understand the appropriate clinical response.	Accepted	All staff will provide competent care in relation to observations and understanding the national early warning signs. Training and clinical supervisions will be provided. Areas of training needs will be identified and supported, and lessons learnt will be shared with the wider team. Training matrix will be completed by all staff and updated when new staff start their induction. Line managers will review quarterly for existing staff members as part of performance reviews.
