1	The Governor and the Head of Healthcare should ensure that there is a robust system in place for calling prisoners to the medication hatch to receive prescribed medication, and that any discrepancies are followed up.	Accepted	<p>The published core day facilitates prisoners attending the treatment hatches twice a day, AM and PM. This is managed by lists of men who require medication, provided by Healthcare.</p> <p>If any changes have to be made to the published core day regime, then the wing manager ensures operational resources are provided to support Healthcare in the dispensing of medication, so that prisoners can receive their prescription at the appropriate time.</p> <p>Any individual issues regarding a prisoner's medication are highlighted by Healthcare to the wing manager or Orderly Officer, so that they be promptly addressed.</p> <p>Any non-attendance to collect medication is recorded by Healthcare and at the end of each</p>	Head of Healthcare/Healthcare Governor	Completed



			<p>medication delivery, patients who require critical medications are seen on a 1:1 basis at their cell. This ensures that vital medication can still be dispensed in person, if a prisoner has not been unlocked or has been missed from the list provided by Healthcare.</p>		
2	<p>The Governor should ensure that a morning welfare check is conducted in line with PSI 75/2011.</p>	Accepted	<p>To ensure all prisoners are in receipt of an early morning welfare check, following the death of Mr Adbussalaam staff were reminded during the morning briefing of the need for a welfare check to be carried out on all prisoners immediately after the briefing has taken place each day. These briefings are scheduled for 07.45hrs every day and last approx 15 minutes.</p> <p>As part of the Covid recovery plan, since September 2021 HMP Liverpool have been able to increase the availability of activities and improve access to the regime for more prisoners. The Head of Safer Custody has undertaken wing assurance checks to confirm that welfare checks are still being conducted prior to the commencement of the regime, including for those that are due to collect their medication.</p> <p>In addition, staff on all residential units now sign to say that a welfare check has been completed.
