Accepted	The Head of Healthcare will ensure staff clearly document and add an alert onto SystemOne to identify somebody who is clinically vulnerable. The Head of Healthcare will also ensure this is to be regularly reviewed and updated.  This is to be implemented by talking to staff at handovers, team meetings and in supervision. 2	The Head of Healthcare should ensure that a clear pulse oximetry pathway is in place in line with NHS England's COVID-19 standard operating procedure in secure and detained settings, and that staff understand its requirements.	Accepted	This has been implemented at HMP Wymott since 2021. All patients who test positive for COVID and it is clinically indicated that they require pulse oximeter, are provided with one to monitor SATS levels. Any concerns regarding SATS levels are reviewed by a nurse.	Healthcare staff	April 2022
3	The Head of Healthcare should ensure that staff use the NEWS2 assessment to identify	Accepted	NEWS2 is to be used when reviewing somebody complaining of feeling unwell as standard practice.
