1	<p>The Governor should review the prison's drugs strategy to ensure that a clear and consistent approach is put in place to tackle the supply and demand of illicit drugs, including prescribed medication.</p>	Accepted	<p>The Drug Strategy has been reviewed by the newly appointed Health and Wellbeing Manager, who sits at senior management level overseeing the Healthcare contract and with strategic oversight over tackling substance abuse and demand of illicit drugs. They have expert knowledge in the area of health and drug strategy.</p> <p>In November 2019 the revised Drug Strategy will be externally scrutinised by a lived experience panel and will be updated based on the feedback.</p> <p>The Health and Wellbeing Manager has reviewed the Terms of Reference for the Drug Strategy meeting and it is now held on a monthly basis. 2	<p>The Governor should provide evidence to the Ombudsman within 28 days of the actions taken to ensure:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Immediate access of ambulances to the prison in emergency situations;</li> <li>• Staff (in particular night staff) fully understand the expectation that preservation of life must take precedence when considering entering a</li> </ul>	Accepted	<p>The Governor has provided assurance to the North Midlands Prison Group Director who has subsequently confirmed to the PPO the action being taken to ensure the immediate access of ambulances to the prison in emergency situations.</p> <p>A scoping exercise will be delivered in partnership with East Midlands Ambulance Service (EMAS) to time the most efficient route to each location in the prison with emergency response vehicles.</p> <p>Staff consultation groups are arranged for November and December 2019 to re-iterate the importance of effective medical emergency response and the precedence of preservation of life. The first event will be delivered in November 2019. A training record of these sessions will be kept by the Safer Custody Team.</p> <p>A dedicated Safer Custody training day is scheduled for January 2019. This will include a session around responding efficiently to emergencies.</p>
