1	<p>The Head of Healthcare at HMP Wakefield should ensure that when prisoners refuse to take critical medications:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • a senior member of healthcare staff speaks to the prisoner and documents this in the medical record; • a medication in-possession risk assessment is carried out and the outcome is recorded in the medical record; and • the prisoner's mental capacity is assessed and the outcome is recorded in the medical record. 	Accepted	<p>When a prisoner refuses to take critical medications they are visited by a member of the team to ascertain the reasons why they are not compliant, they are then added to the multi profession complex case clinic for a multi-disciplinary discussion. The outcome of this is then fed back to the prisoner and they are booked in for follow up if required. Prisoners will be encouraged to comply with their medication however if refusal continues they will be asked to sign an acknowledgement of the risks that this poses to their health.</p> <p>All prisoners have an 'In-possession' status, this may be subject to change if the prisoners presentation changes. The 'In-possession' status is reviewed yearly by a pharmacy technician or nurse to ensure on-going governance and safety.</p> <p>The mental capacity assessment is embedded in the Medication Compliance Local Operating Procedure which is now in practice. Any prisoner refusing to comply with their medication is subject to a mental capacity assessment and referred to Multi-profession complex case clinics to discuss wider issues that may be affecting non-compliance.</p>	<p>Complete</p> <p>Head of Healthcare</p>
2	<p>The Head of Healthcare should ensure that weekly welfare checks are carried out as agreed.</p>	Accepted	<p>Prisoners who are on welfare checks are added to the Multi profession complex case clinic. This takes place weekly to assess the need for continued welfare checks and audit those that have taken place. A prisoner may be discussed on Multi-profession complex case clinic on a time basis decided to be appropriate by the multi-disciplinary team. Daily handover contains a prompt to discuss prisoners of concern allowing any urgent matters to be addressed sooner.</p>	<p>Complete</p> <p>Head of Healthcare</p>
